Eunice Kern's Life Story

Eunice Marie Kern was born on May 13, 1931 to Alfred and Alice Kern in the Leduc area. She placed her faith in Jesus Christ as her Savior as a young girl and was baptized in 1943.

Eunice began her schooling at Dahlgreen Country School (for 8 years) and she graduated from High School at the Christian Training Institute in Edmonton. She remained at C.T.I. in their Bible School and then was employed there as a cook for 4 years. Later, she served on the first North American Baptist God's Volunteer Team in 1956-57. She continued her education and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree from Sioux Falls College in 1963, receiving a Masters of Religious Education in 1965 from the North American Baptist Seminary in Sioux Falls, South Dakota.

Shortly after her graduation, she went to Cameroon, West Africa where she served as a missionary teacher for 15 years at the Saker Baptist College. She returned to the Leduc area to care for her mother. She supported herself through her sewing as well as serving as a part-time secretary at Leduc Fellowship Church.

Eunice's interests included: sewing, crafting, cooking, singing in various groups, being an avid fan of the Edmonton Oilers, and Edmonton Eskimos and playing table games (according to HER rules!)

Eunice has experienced failing health for the last several years and she went home to be with the Lord, June 5, 2015.

She is predeceased by her parents, Alfred and Alice Kern, and her sister-in-law, Joan Kern.

She is remembered by her brother Eugene, and his wife Elenor; her brother, Stan; six nieces and nephews and 8 great nieces and nephews. Her family expresses deep appreciation to Pastor Dennis Gulley and the Fellowship Church family for their faithful support and care of Eunice.
